Noah was a churchwarden at Cradley Chapel and an Ironmaster who started his chain works in Cradley in 1839 before moving to larger premises at Netherton

John Forrest Superintendent

Born at San Cristobal in Spain, 1859.

Was the manager of Whitley Colliery, Halesowen



His classes were popular and a note made on June 28th 1881 showed:-

- average morning attendance 120
- average afternoon attendance 152

John grew up with his first language being Spanish. He arrived in England in 1865.







Mrs Phoebe Bloomer President Two Gates 'Bright Hour'

A 35mm film canister set in the grounds of Two Gate Ragged School. Due to tree cover co-ordinates may be a bit out.


The first sign of human occupation in Dudley Borough was found at Cradley in 2001, this was a chert axe head of the Palaeolithic period, made by a forerunner of our own species, a proto Homo Sapien Neanderthal. It dates to about 475,000 BC and was authenticated by Birmingham University




A landscape study shows that there were four main settlements in the medieval period:

- Netherend,
- Overend,
- Cradley and
- Oldnall.

Oldnall Flint Fields

Nearly 6,000 struck pieces of flint dating to Mesolithic times (Middle Stone Age) have been found on Oldnall fields.



Oldnall Flint Fields

Also found were arrowheads from the later Neolithic and Bronze Ages, as well as a pottery shard from the Iron Age. A dolphin brooch and a glass phial dating from the first four centuries AD, suggest that at one time there was a Romano-British farmstead at Oldnall.

The Broadstone


Formed some 280 million years ago during the carboniferous period, this ancient stone weighs some 15 cwt. A map dated 1610 shows it as a boundary marker between the parishes of Cradley and Lutley at Foxcote Lane. Local folk believed it capable of granting wishes. 'Spit upon it and wish'. Brought from Foxcote Lane and placed here by residents of Two Gates, 27th August 1967


Volunteers will help you find the Broadstone in the chapel grounds.


A lovely scene outside the grocer's shop belonging to Perry.
